

# 2019 ThriveSask Program

# **2018 PILOT PROGRAM**

The ThriveSask Pilot Program was convened and facilitated by the Saskatchewan Economic Development Alliance (SEDA) in 2018. Our aim was to build on momentum established by the Saskatchewan Main Street Program, and provide support for communities and downtown improvement organizations to build resilient and vibrant economies. Acknowledging that 'living heritage' is the foundation on which development in any form is based; economic, individual, collective, our key partner in program delivery was Heritage Saskatchewan.

Additional program partners included; Province of Saskatchewan Parks Culture & Sport; Tourism Saskatchewan and Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association. The pilot program was delivered in five communities and a formal program evaluation is currently underway. Our goal of building an independent capital and technical assistance fund for communities to access was not realized. However, the action planning and implementation framework proved to be very successful.

# 2019 PROGRAM DELIVERY

The Community Activation Component of the ThriveSask model is extremely effective and we wish to offer this aspect of the program to a minimum of three Saskatchewan communities in 2019, based on a partial cost recovery model. We invite expressions of interest (see attached form) from eligible rural communities seeking to mobilize and plan for their future.

# PROGRAM COMPONENTS

#### Community Activation Session

- The one-day community session will be co-facilitated by Heritage Saskatchewan and SEDA. The session is designed to capture the essence of the community past, present and most importantly where it aims to be in the future. A Resource Team of Program Partners (subject to availability) will participate.
- Establishing a set of go forward priorities and associated action plans is an essential component of the fast moving one-day process. Action plans will be set with deliverables of 30, 60 and 90 days. These 30 day timelines are a key success factor of the Strategic Doing® utilized in the program. The community group will move into 'doing' and build on the process every 30 days. If additional priority setting and action plans are required, they will be developed during the 30/30 follow-up meetings.
- An assessment of the community (First Impressions) will be conducted by the visiting resource team and integrated into the Activation Session Report.

# <u>Implementation Support</u>

- Following the activation session, SEDA and program partners will support the local leadership group in achieving outcomes within the scope of the priorities/action plans established. This support will be provided virtually and will include partnership brokering, research, troubleshooting and other such supports as deemed reasonable.
- SEDA will assist in coordinating/accessing funding opportunities and services provided by other agencies to ensure the community leverages all available resources.



Four core pillars provide the framework for building thriving and vibrant communities.

A **Field Guide** for each of the **Four Program Pillars** will serve as an 'owners manual' for local volunteers, elected leaders and staff.

# **LEADERSHIP**

Formal and informal leaders must be future focused to chart the course and engage citizens in the process.

Leaders are action oriented, accountable and partnership driven.

# **ECONOMIC VITALITY**

A multi-dimensional approach that recognizes economic, environmental and social well-being are interdependent.
