Continuing with our regular Board meeting, we were able to review regularly scheduled policies to ensure that we are meeting our governance targets. Our discussions on trends in the heritage environment has led us to continue seeking partnerships to provide our members and the residents in Saskatchewan the best opportunities for learning and advocating for living heritage. We are still in the process of forming a committee to review the Heritage Property Act and propose recommendations on the much-needed updates. The last Board meeting we started the conversation on the TRC Calls to Action and where Heritage Saskatchewan should focus and have decided to further discuss the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) in the next in person meeting. We have been awaiting the release of the Saskatchewan Index of Wellbeing and are thrilled to have been awarded with the National Trust 2019 Governor's Award for this project. Now that the report has been released, the Board is excited to see where this new journey will take us. We continue to be actively engaged in ensuring that the work Heritage Saskatchewan does and the policies we have in place remain relevant and up to date as we embark on the next 10 years.
