Background and Notes

- This material summarizes research that was conducted by *Sask Trends Monitor* for Sandra Massey and Heritage Saskatchewan.
- The project goal was to determine how many people in Saskatchewan worked in heritage occupations and some of the basic characteristics of the employees and their positions.
- The National Occupational Classification (NOC), an occupational classification scheme developed by Statistics Canada and Human Resources Development Canada, was used to construct a list of heritage occupations. The NOC is a 4-digit classification scheme. At the four-digit level, it describes occupational groups at nearly the job title level with approximately 500 different codes. The last digit and/or second last digit of the NOC can be dropped to yield occupational groups at a lower level of detail but still grouped in a meaningful way. For example,
 - librarians (NOC=5111) are part of
 - the "librarians, archivists, conservators and curators" group (NOC=511) which are, in turn, part of
 - the "professional occupations in art and culture" group (NOC=51) which are, in turn, part of
 - the "occupations in art, culture, recreation and sport" group (NOC=5).

Background and Notes (continued)

A broad definition of "heritage occupations" was used.

A heritage worker is someone who understands and uses aspects of living heritage in their work, to address present day concerns/social issues and supports individual and community development in the process.

These are occupations where the day-to-day duties would be influenced by an understanding of heritage. Almost all occupations have some aspect of heritage so we tried to identify those occupations where it would normally be an important part.

■ The definition of a heritage worker was based on the concept of living heritage and UNESCO's definition of "Intangible Cultural Heritage".

The practices, representations, expressions, knowledge, skills - as well as the instruments, objects, artifacts and cultural spaces associated therewith - that communities, groups and, in some cases, individuals recognize as part of their cultural heritage. This intangible cultural heritage, transmitted from generation to generation, is constantly recreated by communities and groups in response to their environment, their interaction with nature and their history, and provides them with a sense of identity and continuity, thus promoting respect for cultural diversity and human creativity.


■ The list of occupations at the 4-digit level was developed by Doug Elliott, Sandra Massey, and several members of Heritage Saskatchewan.

Background and Notes (continued)

- The occupations were grouped into four categories.
 - Heritage occupations were those in which almost all employees in those positions would require an understanding of heritage.
 - At the other extreme were occupations where an understanding of heritage would probably not be required – non-heritage occupations.
 - Many occupations fall between these two extremes and were classified as partly heritage occupations. Almost all occupations involved in the delivery of health and education services were classified in this group. Because the health and education sector is large, it was identified separately in the statistics.
- The list of occupations and their category is attached as Appendix A.
- The statistics that are included in this report are from Statistics Canada's 2011 National Household Survey (NHS) which is the name for the "voluntary census" conducted in 2011. Respondents who were employed were asked to describe the kind of work performed during the week of May 1 to May 7, 2011. These descriptions were coded to the NOC by Statistics Canada.

Employment in Heritage Occupations, Saskatchewan

Figure 1: Employment in Heritage Occupations, Saskatchewan, 2011 (total employment = 529,015)



- In 2011, employment in heritage occupations was 7% of the total employment in the province the equivalent of just under 37,000 individuals working in 64 different occupations.
- Another 25% of those employed were classified as working in an occupation that was "partly" a heritage occupation.
- The "partly a heritage occupation" group were almost equally divided between those working in health and education and those who were working in other industry groups.
- In summary, approximately a third of those employed in Saskatchewan are working in an occupation where an understanding of heritage would be important.



Comparison with Canada as a Whole


Figure 2: Heritage Occupations, Canada and Saskatchewan, 2011



- Employment in heritage occupations is slightly more common in Canada than in Saskatchewan.
- In 2011, 7.9% of employment in Canada was in a heritage occupation compared with 7.0% in Saskatchewan.
- More broadly, 34.9% of employment in Canada was in an occupation classified as "partly a heritage occupation". This compares with 32.4% in Saskatchewan.

Employment by Class of Worker

Figure 3: Heritage Occupation by Class of Worker, Saskatchewan, 2011




- In 2011, 15% of those who were working were selfemployed.
- Those working in heritage occupations were less likely to be self-employed, that is, more likely to be in a paid position. This is particularly true for those working in the health and education sectors.
- Part of the reason for this will be the large number of selfemployed farmers in Saskatchewan. (Farmers were not considered as a heritage occupation.)

Employment by Sex


Figure 4: Heritage Occupations by Sex, Saskatchewan, 2011



- Those employed in heritage occupations are more likely to be women than those who were employed in a nonheritage occupation.
- In 2011, 62% of those employed in a heritage occupation were women compared with 36% of those who were not.
- The proportion is higher among those working in health and education)

Employment by Age Group


Figure 5: Heritage Occupations by Age Group, Saskatchewan, 2011



- The age distribution of those working in heritage occupations is similar to the distribution for others working in Saskatchewan.
- Among those employed in a heritage occupation, 32% were under 35 years of age compared with 36% of those who were not.
- At the other extreme, 21% were 55 years of age or older compared with 23% of those who were not working in a heritage occupation.

Employment by Place of Residence

Figure 6: Heritage Occupations by Place of Residence, Saskatchewan, 2011




- Heritage occupations are somewhat more common in the two major urban centres than in other locations.
- In 2011, 54% of those employed in a heritage occupation lived in the Regina or Saskatoon metropolitan areas. This compares with 46% of those who worked in a non-heritage occupation.
- Those working in an occupation classified as "partly" a heritage occupation are also disproportionately living in Regina or Saskatoon.

Note that the place of work may be different from the place of residence. These figures include those who live in the bedroom communities that surround the two cities.

Labour Force Attachment for Heritage Occupations


Figure 7: Full-Time Full-Year Workers, Saskatchewan, 2010



- The NHS measures annual earnings for occupations by asking respondents to report on their earnings in the year prior to the survey, that is, 2010.
- Only persons who worked throughout 2010 of a full-time basis are reported here so this is gross annual earnings before deductions for "full-time, full-year" workers, that is, those with a strong connection to the labour force.
- The figure shows that heritage workers are as likely as other workers to be full-time, full-year workers. The number of part-time workers in health care means that those in health and education are less likely to be working full-time.

Earnings for Heritage Occupations

Figure 8: Average Earnings for Full-Time Full-Year Workers, Saskatchewan, 2010



- The earnings figures are reported for full-time, full-year workers only and are assumed to be for the same occupation that was reported in the spring of 2011.
- This figure shows that heritage workers have somewhat higher earnings than those in other occupations. This is particularly true for those in the health and education sector.

Summary

- In 2011 approximately 37,000 Saskatchewan residents worked in one of 64 occupations classified as a heritage occupation. This is 7% of the total employment in the province. Another 135,000 (25% of total employment) work in an occupation that was classified as "partly" a heritage occupation.
- Taken together about a third of those working in Saskatchewan work in an occupation where an understanding of heritage would be important.
- Employment in heritage occupations is slightly less common in Saskatchewan than in Canada as a whole.
- Compared with those in non-heritage occupations, those working in heritage occupations are:
 - less likely to be self-employed (13% are);
 - more likely to be women (62%);
 - somewhat more likely to be in the middle (35 to 54 years) age group;
 - somewhat more likely to live in Regina and Saskatoon (54%); and
 - have slightly higher earnings.
