



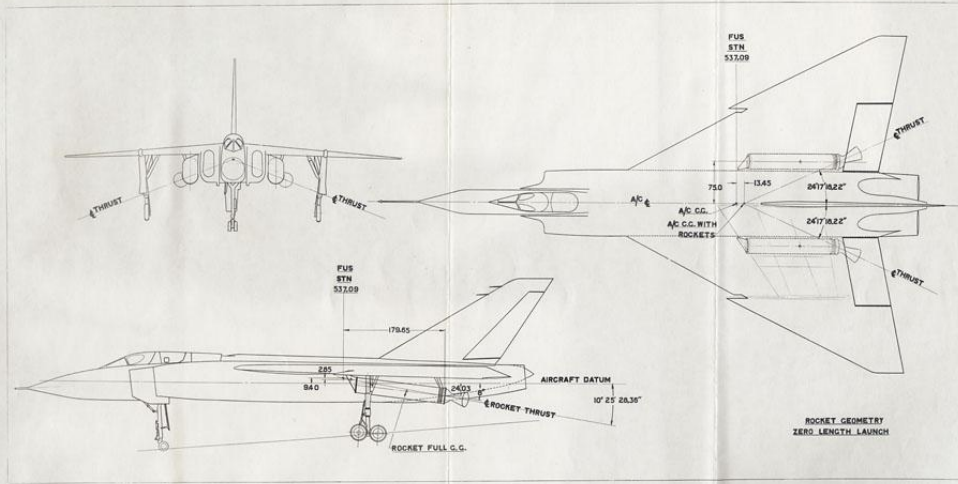

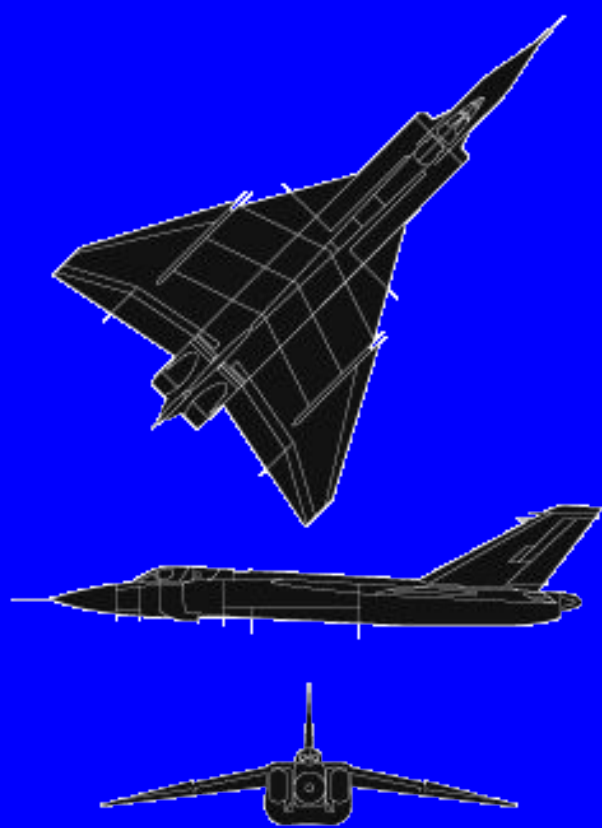
The Beginning of The Arrow

This is The Arrow while it was being built.

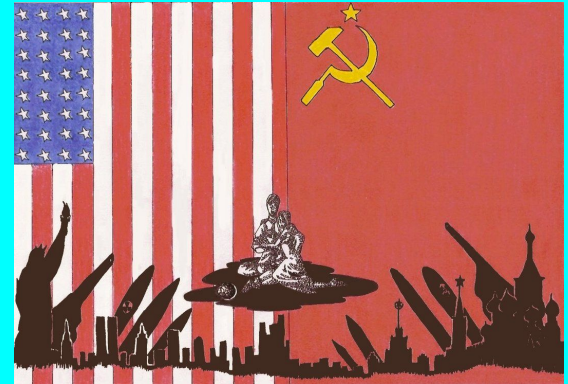
The first flight went smooth with no errors.
